It means that we have the ability to impact life in unexpected and meaningful ways and presses us to find more events and activities that our neighbors can enjoy.

But above these ministries, programs, and activities, my greatest enjoyment is in the people of Good Shepherd. There is a vibrant core of dedicated, thoughtful, energetic members who keep everything going week in and week out. These brothers and sisters are beautiful examples of living faith. I am also certain that they would welcome others to join in the fun of "being church."

I urge everyone to consider this question: "How can I help Good Shepherd fulfill its service to God this year."


