Back in December's YARN, I introduced you to Julian of Norwich, my favorite English medieval mystic. She was an amazing visionary. Her work "Showings" epitomizes the goal of mysticism – a spiritual connection or union with a transcendent "One-ness."

The Chinese would call that oneness "Tao" while the Christian would call it "God" or "Jesus." The experience of this connection is sometimes devoutly sought through prayer and meditative contemplation, but it can come to anyone, unbidden. It is, therefore, something that any of us could experience at some time in our lives. That's what makes mysticism so interesting for me in my faith journey.

Julian wrote about her encounter with Jesus in prose. George Herbert (1593-1633) wrote in poetry and verse. His most famous work, (published just after his death) is entitled *The Temple*, which paints spiritual images of the church. It includes three poems entitled "Love."

Love (III)

Love bade me welcome: yet my soul drew back,

Guilty of dust and sin.

But quick-eyed Love, observing me grow slack

From my first entrance in,

Drew nearer to me, sweetly questioning, If I lacked anything.

A guest, I answered, worthy to be here:

Love said, you shall be he.

I the unkind, ungrateful? Ah my dear,

I cannot look on thee.

Love took my hand, and smiling did reply,

Who made the eyes but I?

Truth Lord, but I have marred them: let my shame Go where it doth deserve.

And know you not, says Love, who bore the blame?

My dear, then I will serve.

You must sit down, says Love, and taste my meat:

So I did sit and eat.
