May carries us through the rest of Eastertide (7 Sundays) to the Day of Pentecost. Pentecost is the spiritual birthday of the church – ALL Christian churches. When the Holy Spirit came into the spirits of the disciples, they became connected to God and Jesus in a new and eternal way. From that day forward, God would dwell within us – not in some holy building, but actually in US! On that day, we became the holy building which will always be Christ's body. Some people mark the day of their baptism as their "new birthday in Christ," but collectively, that day is Pentecost.

The word Pentecost is a Greek word that means "fifty" – fifty days. The disciples (good Jews that they were) were in the upper room because it was the jewish festival of "Shavuot" which in Hebrew means "weeks." Shavuot was celebrated fifty days after the Passover. Fifty days is "a week of weeks" – hence, in Greek, Pentecost.

So, as we approach Pentecost (on May 28 this year), I encourage you to think about the Church's birthday, and the many ways the Church has made a difference in the world. Understand that some of those "differences" have been problematic (think "the Inquisition" or "the Troubles" in Ireland), but those problems are not a sign of the failure of the Holy Spirit, but a failure of our human interpretation.

And don't forget to think of all the good things, too!

All birthdays are opportunities for reflection – maybe especially Pentecost.
