(Please read Isaiah 9:1-7 and Matthew 1:18-25) Jesus Is the Reason We Celebrate

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Sacred Encounters:

The Power and Presence of Jesus Christ in Luke-Acts

Lesson Four: Mary and Martha Encounter Jesus

This lesson uses the familiar story in Luke about the sisters, Mary and Martha. In this lesson's **sacred encounter**, Martha asserts to Jesus that Mary is not helping with her "many tasks" and Jesus responds by praising Mary who has "chosen the better part." We are challenged to read this story with imagination and fresh eyes.

The interpretation that Martha's choice to take care of her "many tasks" is seen as less insightful than Mary's choice to sit at the feet of Jesus can be traced back to 200 CE and a Greek scholar named Origen. He emphasized that Mary **stands Highest** over Martha and brother, Lazarus by listening closely to Jesus.

As we take a second look at Jesus's relationship to Martha and her family, we see a truer picture of the scene. What was seen as condemnation, may well have been a kinder request to join in the important time of listening.

The **Main Idea** that our lesson teaches is that Jesus calls us to value the role of **each person** in the community of faith. **Both** Mary and Martha are serving an important role in the ministry of Jesus.

We continually see how Jesus uses women in his ministry and how he often subverted cultural norms.

A discussion about "caregivers" was also included in this lesson. Each member shared examples from their own experiences about caregivers and how we as individuals and as a congregation can reach out to these people. We added known caregivers to our prayer list for the month.

What was it that made your night special?



members are still eating. At the conclusion of coffee hour the assigned team can take home any leftovers or offer them to the congregation members.


#2. Any food returned to the fridge should be clearly marked so that it gets used properly...waste not, want not.
