#### **DEACON AND WORSHIP MINISTRY NEWS**



Here we are. We made it through a hot and eventful summer. The Good Shepherd congregation is very good at keeping their connections strong. Some things that contribute to this are our commitment to weekly worship and fellowship afterwards. We are very thankful for the many people who weekly prepare food for us all to enjoy. We have a chance to meet upstairs after worship and get caught up with each other's lives. This is a gift we give to each other. And then there is the way so many of us feed each other spiritually from week to week. We have thoughtful and stimulating sermons presented by Pastor Kerry to spur us on and many congregants who are willing to share their faith through weekly leadership in worship, through music that is played and sung, and through prayers shared on our Prayer Chain and vestibule bulletin board, baptizing and welcoming several new families into our fellowship, forming a PNC to begin the process of a pastoral search, installing two Deacons and one Session member to service, forming a small handbell ensemble to make music in the future, collecting 95 backpacks and 80 pillows for donation to those in need, and planning for a community outreach called "Shepherd's Mart."
